August, observed as Women's Month, was marked by a significant boost in road safety operations across Limpopo's five districts, led by female law enforcement officers. The initiative gained momentum with Limpopo Premier Dr. Phophi Ramathuba's presence at the launch of SAPS Limpopo's Operation Basadi Event in Thohoyandou on August 8, 2024

A total of 34 high-impact roadblocks are being conducted, focusing on key areas such as:

- Road safety
- Combating drunken driving

These operations have already

yielded positive results, with a notable reduction in critical offenses that lead to crashes.

The primary objective of these operations is to:

- Reduce critical offenses leading to crashes

- Maximize communication and publicity on enforcement issues

Furthermore, this initiative aims to expose law enforcement career opportunities to the girl child and celebrate the gains made in empowering women over the past 30 years of South Africa's democracy.


