Makhado - The MEC for Transport and Community Safety, Ms Violet Mathye, yesterday, 11 June 2026, led a comprehensive overview and live demonstration of the newly deployed Intelligent Transport System by Calmex Mobile at The Anza Lifestyle Lodge in Makhado. The department has entered into negotiated bus subsidy contracts with nine operators across the province.

The system, developed by Calmex Mobile, features automated fare collection, real-time monitoring, scheduling and dispatching, as well as CCTV and fare evasion detection capabilities.

The demonstration gave stakeholders first-hand insight into how the technology will modernise public transport operations across the province. "With this new system, every trip, every ticket, and every kilometre will be tracked and verified," said CEO of Calmex Mobile, Velaphi Mathebula during the project overview.

Addressing attendees, MEC Mathye said: “Today, this system will bring change to the bus system and to operators as we move from the old manual system and pilot the transition to a digital system.”

The Department of Transport and Community Safety views the pilot as a critical step toward a digitised, transparent, and commuter-friendly transport network. The system is expected to improve operational efficiency, curb revenue losses from fare evasion, and enhance commuter safety and experience through better scheduling and monitoring.

The Department has appointed Calmex Mobile as the service provider for the next five years. The company will roll out an electronic bus monitoring system that tracks trips in real time, records ticketing data, and provides verifiable reports on service delivery.

MEC Mathye was accompanied by the Head of Department, Stephen Matjena, and senior management of the department. The delegation experienced the system first-hand by taking a bus ride with stakeholders and management to test the automated fare collection and ticket dispatching functions.

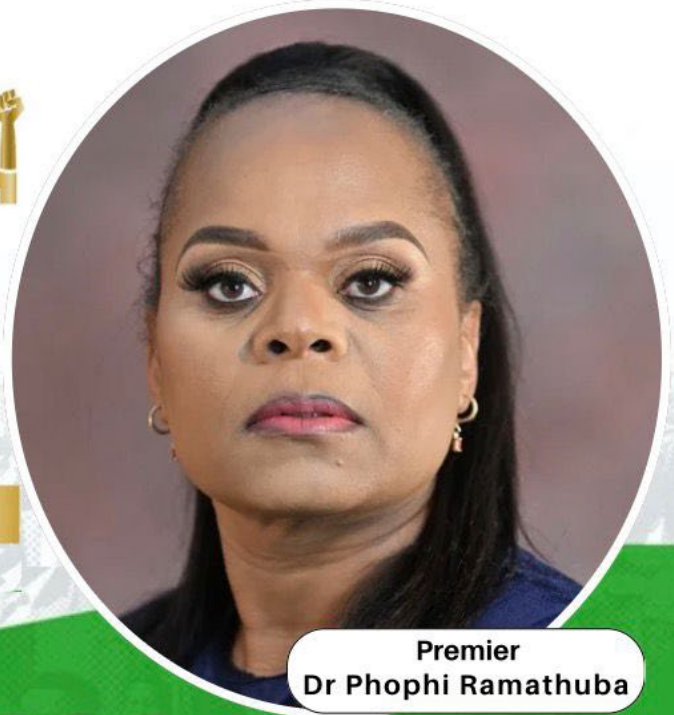

A VISIT OF CONDOLENCE IN MAROBALA

Two young lives, full of laughter and dreams, were taken over the weekend when a vehicle struck them down. No words can fill that kind of silence, but government came to sit with the pain.

She was joined by Polokwane Executive Mayor Cllr John Mpe, Kgoshi Malesela Dikgale, and leaders from traditional and government structures. We did not come with solutions for grief. We came with our presence, our tears, and condolences from the people of Limpopo. We came to say, "Your children mattered, your loss is our loss, and you do not mourn alone".

Cllr. Mpe spoke through sorrow that was hard to hide. He urged all of community and government together to make sure these two children are laid to rest with the dignity they deserve. Kgoshi Dikgale thanked government for showing up in the family's darkest hour, reminding them that leadership means being there when it hurts most.

MEC Mathye's voice broke as she spoke to the

families: "We are experiencing grief and are greatly saddened by a loss of young lives, an irreversible event that is going to stay in our memories forever. May the families find healing in God and the souls of our children rest in peace."

"The Department of Transport and Community Safety holds young lives in the highest regard. This loss cuts deep because every child lost on our roads is a future stolen. A name that will never be called in a classroom again. A pair of shoes that will never be outgrown. As we mourn with the Sathege and Mailula families, we must also look at ourselves. Road safety begins with each of us. Slow down near villages and schools. Put your phone down. Stop when children are crossing. Drive like the child you hit is your own. Let these two angels be the last we lose this way. May their memory remind us to choose care over speed, and life over haste", said MEC Mathye.

JOINT MULTIDISCIPLINARY OPERATION YIELDS RESULTS IN SESHEGO

Polokwane - Limpopo SAPS Provincial Commissioner, Lt. Gen. Thembi Hadebe led a successful stakeholder engagement session in Seshego, Capricorn District, bringing police and community to one table. The conversation was followed by a multidisciplinary operation on Matlala Road at the Seshego junction.

Stop-and-checks and vehicle inspections were carried out, with the Automated Number Plate Recognition vehicle scanning for outstanding fines and warrants of arrest.

The operation was firm and focused. In a matter of hours, 220 vehicles and 540 individuals were stopped and searched. Two(2) motorists were arrested for drunk driving, three(3) undocumented foreign nationals were detained, 83 warrants of arrest were executed with 63 warrants settled on the spot. Each number reflects lives touched and risks reduced on Limpopo roads.

At the parade, Lt. Gen. Hadebe turned her gratitude

to the men and women in blue. "All the accolades associated with me I am dedicating them to you and as I leave the service, I will never forget you and the hard work you put in fighting crime in this province. I am very proud of the police in Limpopo, may God bless you," said the province's first female Provincial Commissioner.

Her words were both farewell and faith, reminding everyone that safety is built by presence, partnership, and pride in service.

- **Payments with an incorrect or missing reference will be regarded as not paid**, and the infringement will remain outstanding on the National Traffic Contravention Management System (NTCMS).

If you have already made a payment with the wrong reference, please visit your nearest provincial traffic station with:

- Proof of payment (bank statement or receipt), and
- The original traffic summons.

Staff will update the system and clear the debt, preventing any future stops or enforcement actions for non payment.

By using the correct summons number, you help us keep records accurate, avoid unnecessary delays, and maintain smooth traffic law enforcement across the province.

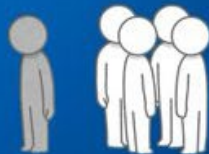

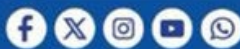
