**Polokwane** - The SAPS has officially announced the appointment of Lieutenant General Jan Petrus Scheepers as the new Provincial Commissioner of Limpopo, effective 1st August 2026. The announcement was made by Acting National Commissioner, Lieutenant General Puleng Dimpane at the Premier's Office in Polokwane.

Welcoming the appointment, MEC Violet Mathye said, "The appointment of Lieutenant General Jan Scheepers marks an important step in strengthening policing and community safety in Limpopo. We look forward to working closely with him to enhance crime prevention initiatives, improve public safety and build safer communities across the province."

According to Limpopo Premier Dr Phophi Ramathuba, "The fight against Gender-Based Violence and Femicide (GBVF) must remain a provincial priority." She called on all stakeholders to work together to create safer communities and protect the rights and dignity of women and children.

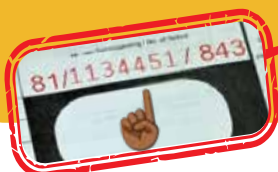

INFRINGEMENT FINES PROMPTLY AND CORRECTLY!**

To ensure that payments are allocated to the right case, the reference on any EFT or ATM transaction must be the **summons number** printed at the **top right corner** of the traffic fine notice.



- **Do not** use your vehicle registration number, name, or surname as the reference.
- **Payments with an incorrect or missing reference will be regarded as not paid**, and the infringement will remain outstanding on the National Traffic Contravention Management System (NTCMS).

**If you have already made a payment with the wrong reference, please visit your nearest provincial traffic station with:**

- Proof of payment (bank statement or receipt), and
- The original traffic summons.

Staff will update the system and clear the debt, preventing any future stops or enforcement actions for non payment.

By using the correct summons number, you help us keep records accurate, avoid unnecessary delays, and maintain smooth traffic law enforcement across the province.

"We are excited to welcome Glenn Jones to Limpopo. His music has touched generations. But as we sing along to 'All For You' tonight, let's make a promise to get there safely and to get home safely. Glenn is singing 'All For You', but **drunk driving is not for you**."

July was a reminder of how dangerous our roads can be. 137 drunk drivers were arrested in Limpopo during Mandela Month. The MEC says we cannot let that trend continue this weekend.

"One drink can change everything. One bad decision can turn a night of celebration into a family tragedy. This Women's Month, as we reflect on 70 Years since the 1956 Women's March, let us honor that legacy by protecting lives. The best way to empower our communities is to keep them safe."

**On 9 August 2026, South Africa will mark the 70th anniversary of the 1956 Women's March. On that day, more than 20 000 women marched to the Union Buildings to protest the extension of Pass Laws and the Urban Areas Act.**

The commemoration will be held under the theme: "***Empowered Women Empower the Nation***" and will pay tribute to the women of 1956 who fought for human rights, gender equality, and social justice.

Led by iconic figures such as Lilian Ngoyi, Helen Joseph, Rahima Moosa, and Sophia Williams-De Bruyn, the march became a defining moment in South Africa's struggle for equality and justice. Their courageous chant, "Wathint' Abafazi, Wathint' Imbokodo" ("You strike a woman, you strike a rock"), continues to inspire South Africa's commitment to advancing gender equality, women's empowerment, and social justice.

The commemoration falls under the broader Milestones of Freedom Campaign under the theme: "***Honouring the Past, Delivering the Future.***"

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
