During Mandela Month in July, 137 drunk drivers were arrested in Limpopo. We do not want to add to that number this weekend. Our K78 Women-Led Law Enforcement Operations are active across the province for the entire month of August. Officers will be on the all the roads in the Province.

The plan is simple:

If you are going to drink, don't drive.

If you are driving, don't drink.

Get a designated driver. Use a taxi. Use public transport.

Road crashes don't just happen. They are caused by choices. And this long weekend, you can choose life.

As we celebrate 70 years since women marched to the Union Buildings demanding dignity and freedom, let us march forward with the same spirit of responsibility. An empowered nation is a safe nation.
